Specific educational objectives	The course refers to the typical educational activities and belongs to the scientific area of Business Administration.
	The course focuses on the selected topics from the CFA Institute Curriculum related to the financial statements and valuation analysis and serves as the tutoring lectures for students participating in the CFA Italy Global Investment Challenge completion.  Attention will be given to the Ethics and Professional Standards of Practice, followed by the Fundamental Analysis theory, Equity Market and individual securities valuation and return analysis, and simulation analysis. Some attention will be given to the Ratio and Financial analysis of the financial statements.  Theoretical material will be supplemented by the practical work on preparing an investment report on the public Italian firm selected by the CFA Italy Society.  The course will enable the students to develop the theoretical
	knowledge and practical skills related to the investment analysis and report creation.
	The course will provide an initial overview of the CFA Institute
	exam and will cover the topics related to ethics and corporate finance readings from CFA curriculum, serving as an introductory course for those willing to take and pass the CFA exams required to obtain the CFA Charter
