Course description:	The course introduces the necessary of the connection of the research question, the theoretical base and the mode of scientific knowledge production by different ways of research (and development).
Specific educational objectives:	This course enables students to gain an understanding of sociological and pedagogical theories, models and practices in the context of research.  Students get familiar with the different stages of a research process; get a feeling of different approaches and outcomes.  They understand the necessity of coherence between the research question and the research setting.
List of topics covered:	The course covers the following topics: descriptive and explanatory research; quantitative and qualitative approaches and epistemological implications; measurement, sampling, and design issues in generating research questions; formulating research questions and planning an enquiry; the role of theories in the different approaches; ethical standards for scientific inquiry; involving stakeholders; activating users; how to do an interview for social research; biographies as qualitative data for social research.
Teaching format:	Interactive teaching with discussion in small sub-groups;
Learning outcomes:	Getting to know different types of research designs in relation to the research aim
