Course description and specific educational objectives	The course belongs to the class "caratterizzante" in the curriculum in Design.
	Course description:
	The course will approach landscape and portrait as a genre within the realm of representation and depiction. The course would set some questions about the idea of portrait and landscape. What do we consider portrait or a landscape, how do we relate to it, how far are we from the depiction and the documentation.  The course will focus on the narrow space in between authorial and documentary aspects in photography.  All students will start a process to finalize in a book project. The steps will be discussed trough reviews based on printed material. Final presentation is the project of a book and the project of an exhibition.  Specific exercises will be discussed and proposed during the course.
