Course description and specific educational objectives	The course belongs to the class "caratterizzante" in the curriculum in Design and "di base" in the curriculum in Art. From 2018/19 onward it belongs to the class "caratterizzante" for both curricula.
	Course description: This course aims at conveying the main principles and working methods of typography. Based on technical skills, cultural understanding and design-thinking participants are expected to develop towards independent personalities.
	This course can be repeated from students enrolled before 2018/19 as optional course only if the mandatory exam has been given with another lecturer. However, as the maximum number of students defined for the course is 30, students who still have to do the mandatory exam have priority.
