It covers some of the main areas of scientific and academic communication to assist students in the linguistic aspects of their research. Specific educational objectives include the following: • to improve academic and scientific writing skills through subject-specific materials; • to improve spoken interaction and production through the production of academic presentations; • to improve receptive skills, especially critical reading skills, through the exposure to and analysis of various types of written and spoken texts; • to develop grammatical and lexical accuracy to improve fluency.

List of topics covered	 Topics covered include: how to write research texts including descriptions of methodologies, presenting arguments, evaluating processes, ideas and theories; how to reference and cite sources correctly; how to write abstracts; how to write the Transdisciplinary Meta-Reflection (TMR); how to improve academic and domain-specific vocabulary, also through word-building techniques; how to prepare and deliver oral presentations. Emphasis is placed on improving the four main skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking) through practical, communicative tasks.
Teaching format	Teaching format is based on the seminar format which envisages teacher and student co-operation and participation in the classroom through individual, pair and group work.

Expected learning outcomes	 Knowledge and understanding: Knowledge of advanced grammatical structures and subject- specific academic and professional lexis at the C1 level, understanding of authentic spoken and written texts, including specialised texts.
	 Applying knowledge and understanding: Producing subject-specific academic texts providing descriptions of methodologies, presenting arguments, evaluating processes, ideas and theories, and formulating opinions in written and oral texts. Producing the TMR for the Transfolder.
	 Making judgments: Integrating knowledge and understanding acquired in the course with knowledge and understanding from other courses to achieve academic and professional goals in the field of Eco-social design.
	• <u>Communication skills:</u> Communicating effectively with a degree of fluency both in speaking and in writing. Adapting style and register to show awareness of the intended purposes and audience.
	 <u>Learning skills:</u> Ability to pursue autonomous learning based on the input provided in class and on the feedback received.
