RESEARCH

Research interests

I am interested in the anthropology of marginality and nomadism with ethnographic attention to the Sinti in Northern Italy. More recently, I have been concentrating on marginality and multi-species ethnography working with alpine shepherds and high alpine ecosystems. Both subjects tie in with questions relating to land(s) in the European Alps.

Furthermore, I am interested in begging economies and theories of gift-giving based on my own ethnographic experiences of begging and selling with Sinti. My interest in ethnographic approaches to archives is inspired by the mnemonic practices of the Sinti as well as those of the alpine shepherds and relates especially to debates on the construction of time and space.

In order to balance my questions about marginality and nomadism, I have spent several years studying policy-making of the EU and the Italian state. I was particularly interested in how the *inclusion* of the Romani people is represented and practiced by public officials.

Ethnographic Fieldwork

My actual ethnographic research focuses on alpine shepherds and issues concerning the return of the wolf in the Eastern Alps. My approach is that of a multispecies ethnography, connecting to debates on ontology and multispecies research in anthropology, art and biology.

My ethnographic fieldwork with semi-nomadic Sinti was an experience of complete immersion in non-sedentary and marginal life, which I shared with the Sinti living in a caravan for three years (1997-2000). That research was followed by ethnographic research on Sinti schooling in Northern Italy (9 months, 2001-2002) and ethnographic archival research on nomadic patterns in relation to Sinti mnemonic practices.

The ethnographic research (15months) in European Institutions (European Commission Brussel and Council of Europe Strasbourg) as well as public institutions in Italy (Rome, Bolzano) focused on the study of policies of romani integration (2014-2017).

My research with South Tyrolean marksmen was commissioned by the province of South Tyrol (2008). It focused on the female experience of participating in subnational political movements in the Tyrol region. Main methodological approach was participation and open-ended interviews.
