



Roberto FARNETI is Associate Professor of Political Science in the Faculty of Economics and Management. A political theorist specializing in the Theory of International Relations and the History of Political Thought, Roberto has had visiting research and teaching posts at the University of California, Los Angeles (2003-5), Columbia University (2003), Oxford University (2000), and Brown University (2000). He has been the recipient of an Alexander von Humboldt Fellowship for Experienced Researchers at the *Exzellenzcluster* on 'Normative Orders' of the J.W. Goethe Universität, Frankfurt am Main, from September 2009 through December 2011 (for three non consecutive semesters).

His work has appeared in peer-refereed journals such as the *Cambridge Review of International Affairs* (2013), *History of Political Thought* (2006, 2007 and 2012), *Critical Inquiry* (2006), *Theory & Event* (2008), *Polity* (2009), *The Review of Politics* (2009), *Democratic Theory* (2017), and the *Journal of Political Ideologies* (2012). Roberto is the author of the books *Mimetic Politics: Dyadic Patterns in Global Politics* (Michigan State University Press 2015), *Effetto Israele. La sinistra, la destra e il conflitto mediorientale* (Carocci 2015) and *Il canone moderno: Filosofia politica e genealogia* (Bollati Boringhieri 2002). He is also co-editor (with S. Baroncelli, I. Horga, and S. Vanhoonacker) of the volume *Teaching and Learning the European Union: Traditional and Innovative Methods* (Springer 2013).
