Hannes Hofmeister

Hannes Hofmeister is Assistant Professor of European Law at the University of Bozen, Faculty of Economics. Before joining the Faculty he has been a lecturer and senior research fellow at the Universities of Innsbruck, Regensburg, Cambridge and a Max Weber Fellow Postdoctoral Fellow at the European University Institute in Florence, where he specialised in European and International Law as well as International Relations. Since then his research has focussed on issues of European Integration and current issues of international law, in particular aspects relating to the use of force in international relations and the problem of non-state actors in international public law. He is also interested in international human rights law. Whenever possible, he tries to adopt an interdisciplinary perspective, attempting to combine legal, political and economic arguments. His work has been published in internationally renowned peer-reviewed journals, such as the *European Law Journal* et al. Hannes holds degrees from the University of Cambridge and the University of Regensburg, where he has been a scholar of the national merit foundation. He has made a number of presentations at international conferences in Cambridge (CELS Lunchtime Lecture on 18 November 2010 on the financial crisis), Florence (MWP Lecture Series on 21 January 2008, Assessing the legality of a military strike against Iran's nuclear facilities) et al.
