### **Short CV with the most important academic stations since PhD**

Following the completion of my PhD I was a lecturer and senior research fellow at the Universities of Innsbruck, Regensburg, Cambridge and a Max Weber Postdoctoral Fellow at the European University Institute in Florence, where I specialised in European Law and International Law as well as International Relations. Whenever possible, I attempt to adopt an interdisciplinary perspective, attempting to combine legal, political and economic arguments. My work has been published in internationally renowned peer-reviewed journals, such as the European Law Journal, The Georgetown Journal of international affairs, the Columbia Journal of European Law et alt.. I do hold degrees from the University of Cambridge (Trinity College) and the University of Regensburg, where I have been a scholar of the national merit foundation. I have made a number of presentations at international conferences in Cambridge (CELS Lunchtime Lecture on the financial crisis), Florence (MWP Lecture Series on 'Assessing the legality of a military strike against Iran's nuclear facilities') et alt.

### **Main research topics**

My research has focused on issues of European Integration and current issues of international law, in particular aspects relating to withdrawal from the EU/ Eurozone and on the use of force in international relations and the problem of non-state actors in international public law. I am also interested in international human rights law, in particular the right to academic freedom. Whenever possible, I try to adopt an interdisciplinary perspective, attempting to combine legal, political and economic arguments.
