Marta Tomasi currently holds a post-doc position at the Free University of Bozen-Bolzano. Her research concerns the implementation of EU law in Regions with special autonomy. In the past few years she conducted research activities for the European Centre for Law, Science and New Technologies of the University of Pavia (research project about Monitoring and Evaluating Legal and Ethical Aspects of Newborn Genetic Screening) and for the University of Trento (research project about the protection of children in same-sex families in the context of the EU funded project "Rights on the move", looking at the European protection of the rights of rainbow families (www.unitn.it/rotm)).

She is involved in teaching activities in public law and comparative constitutional law for the Faculty of Economics of the Free University of Bozen-Bolzano and for the Faculty of Law of the University of Trento. In particular, she teaches the *Public law* module in the *Introduction to legal systems course* for the *Bachelor in Tourism, Sport and Event Management*.

In 2012 she received her PhD in Comparative and European Legal Studies from the Faculty of Law of the University of Trento, defending a thesis in Comparative constitutional law titled "Human Genetics and the Protection of Fundamental Rights: the Relational Dimension of Individual Autonomy".

During her academic studies she spent a period as a Visiting Scholar by the Hastings College of the Law in San Francisco and The King's College in London.

Her main fields of interest are comparative constitutional law, biolaw and bioethics, the protection of fundamental rights in biomedicine, children's rights, immigration law.

She is the author of several papers and articles published in national and international scientific journals.

Since 2007 she's been cooperating with the Biolaw Project of the Faculty of Law in Trento and contributed to several national and European projects.

She's in charge, together with some colleagues, for the update and implementation of the website www.biodiritto.org.
