### **LUCIA BUSATTA**

**Lucia Busatta** holds a PhD in Comparative and European Legal Studies, University of Trento, Italy (2012).

In July 2018 Dr. Lucia Busatta obtain the National Scientific Abilitation as Associate Professor in Constitutional Law.

#### **Scientific activities**

Between April 2016 and April 2018, she worked as post-doc research fellow at the Department of Public, International and EU Law at the University of Padua, Italy, dedicating her research activity to the impact of cross-border healthcare on national healthcare systems.

Between November 2012 and January 2016, she worked as a post-doc research fellow at the Faculty of Law of the University of Trento. The fellowship received between 2015 and 2016 was granted among the activities financed by the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research for a project of national relevance (P.R.I.N.). Between 2012 and 2014 she worked on a research on The effectiveness of the guarantee of minority groups in Trentino: principle of equality and institutional instruments.

Since 2012 Dr. Lucia Busatta took part in several national and international research projects focusing on constitutional rights and human rights protection.

#### **Teaching activities**

In academic year 2017/2018, Dr. Lucia Busatta held a course on Legislation and Organisation of services for families and minors (42 hours) at the School of Psychology, University of Padua.

Since September 2011 she is a Teaching Assistant in the course of European and Public Law (course leader Prof. Stefania Baroncelli), Bachelor in Economics and Social Sciences, Free University of Bozen (I). Since February 2016 she is also a Teaching Assistant in the MA course of Public Law (course leader Prof. Stefania Baroncelli), Master in Economics and Management of the Public Sector Free, University of Bozen (I).

Between September 2011 and June 2014, she has been Teaching Assistant in the course of Constitutional Law (course leaders Prof. Carlo Casonato and Prof. Cinzia Picocchi), Faculty of Law, University of Trento.

Between 2009 and 2012 she was involved in tutoring activity for the course of Introduction to Law (Principles of Public and Private Law) at the Faculty of Economics of the University of Trento.

#### **Other academic activities**

In February 2017 she has been a visiting researcher at the School of Law of the University of Sheffield.

Between September 2014 and March 2017, she was appointed as expert in BioLaw in the Bioethics Committee for Clinical Practice of Belluno Local Health Authority.

Since May 2014 she is a member of the editorial board of *BioLaw Journal – Rivista di BioDiritto*, a peer reviewed, online law journal focusing on the relationships between law and life sciences under a comparative perspective ([www.biodiritto.org/rivista](http://www.biodiritto.org/rivista)).

Since 2012 she is co-responsible for the research project website ([www.biodiritto.org](http://www.biodiritto.org)), highlighting case



law and legislation that are of interest in the area of biolaw.

In 2009 she joined the BioLaw research team at the Faculty of Law of the University of Trento and, between 2009 and 2011, she took part to the research activities of Firb 2007 project, on the *Impact of biotechnological innovations of fundamental rights* ([www.biodiritto.org](http://www.biodiritto.org)). Her research interests concern fundamental rights' protection, the right to health, reproductive rights, biolaw, territorial autonomy and asymmetries in decentralised states and linguistic and social rights.

Between 2007 and 2010 she cooperated to the management of Co.Co.A. Summer School (Comparing Constitutional Adjudication), organised by the Department of Legal Sciences of the University of Trento and funded by the European Commission, Marie Curie Actions, 6<sup>th</sup> Framework Programme, Scientific Coordinator Prof. Roberto Toniatti.

### **Conferences and Publications**

She presented papers and research proceedings in several conferences and seminars, both at national and international level, where she was either selected after a call for papers or invited as an expert.

Lucia published several research articles and essays, in Italian and in English, on different peer-reviewed law journals and in edited books. She is also co-editor, with S. Bonini and I. Marchi, of a book on Law and Exceptions (*L'Eccezione nel Diritto*), published by Editoriale Scientifica, Naples, 2015.

In 2018, Dr. Lucia Busatta published an extensive monograph on the right to healthcare: Lucia Busatta, *La salute sostenibile. La complessa determinazione del diritto al accedere alle prestazioni sanitarie*, Giappichelli, Torino, 2018.

### **Education and Training**

On April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2012 she defended her PhD thesis on *Il diritto alla salute a geometria variabile [Constitutional guarantees for the right to healthcare]*, supervisor Prof. Carlo Casonato; dissertation committee: Prof. Paolo Carrozza, Prof. Antonio D'Aloia and Prof. Paolo Veronesi. Her main fields of research are the guarantees of the right to healthcare, between regional, State and European levels and principle of equality, human dignity and fundamental rights protection.

During her PhD programme, between 2010 and 2011, she has been visiting researcher at King's College London, at the School of Law of the University of Glasgow and at the Department of Law, Universitat Pompeu Fabra, Barcelona.

On July 9<sup>th</sup> 2008, was awarded, by the University of Trento, Faculty of Law, a graduate studies law degree (2 years) defending a thesis on *Human dignity in constitutional adjudication: a comparative law approach*, supervisor Prof. Carlo Casonato, mark 110/110. The thesis was awarded the second position in the prize for graduation thesis on Bioethics and Biolaw, granted by the Research Ethics Committee of the University of Trento (2010 edition).

In 2008 she attended a formative course on *Women, Politics and Institutions*, organised by the University of Trento and co-founded by the Ministry of Fair Opportunities.

In 2006, she received her BA equivalent degree (three years), in European and Transnational Legal Sciences, by the University of Trento, Faculty of Law, with a thesis on *Right to Life and Abortion in the Irish Constitutional Law*. During her BA programme, in academic year 2004/2005, she attended as an exchange student the University of Limerick, College of humanities, Faculty of Law, within the Campus Europae Project, linked to the Socrates-Erasmus one; between August and September 2005, she was selected for a training experience at the Autonomous Province of Trento, Department for the Relationship with the European Union, Structural Funds Office, working on a project on *EU Structural Funds interventions for 2007-2013*.
