- Experience and knowledge of the **use of English in multilingual environments and speakers**:
 - I have extensive teaching experience in plurilingual environments, particularly at the trilingual Free University of Bolzano. Having taught both students and staff, I have gained insights into the role English plays in such a linguistic ecology, including both the opportunities it can provide but also the inherent potential for tension that can be associated with plurilingual contexts.
 - Through my research assistant position I was able to investigate the role of English in multilingual companies based in South Tyrol to investigate how English was being used in bilingual and often plurilingual contexts. My research involved developing online questionnaires in order to gain qualitative and quantitative data. Moreover, in-depth information was gained through interviews with employees working in these multilingual companies. Survey Monkey was used to create and administer these questionnaires and Nvivo was used to annotate and analyse the interview data as well as carry out a thematic analysis of the data.
A second strand of this research focused on creating a learner corpus on Sketch Engine. Data and sample written texts were gathered from students at the Free University of Bolzano in order to build this learner corpus.
 - Through my Master's Degree in Education (Applied Linguistics), I developed experience and **expertise in both qualitative and quantitative research and software**. In particular, through the module, 'Educational Enquiry', I gained knowledge of the following issues and methodologies in qualitative research: exploratory orientations in research design, unstructured data (for example documents, observational data and interview data), documenting discursive strategies, developing research questions and designs, selecting cases and sampling within cases, and methods of qualitative data collection. In terms of

quantitative research, I was able to develop expertise in rationale for quantification, sources of quantitative data, quantitative observational data, validity and reliability, questionnaires and structured interviews, and quantitative data analysis.

I was able to apply this knowledge in two small-scale, mixed methods studies as part of my studies:

- 'An evaluation of the effectiveness of the ESOL Core Curriculum for Long-Term Indian Immigrants, investigated through a linguistic analysis of an extract from a written text and a conversation in English produced by members of this group.' (spoken and written oral data collection and analysis)
 - 'An investigation into the effectiveness of the Teaching-Learning cycle to teach the formal letter genre on an asynchronous online platform.' (development of online writing course, using the online english360 platform, based on the Teaching-Learning cycle; recruitment of participants for the course; analysis of effectiveness of the course (pre- and post-testing; survey data collection and analysis using Excel))

My research involved developing online questionnaires in order to gain qualitative and quantitative data.
