

## Short Bio

Bernd Frick is Professor of Organizational, Media, and Sports Economics in the Management Department at Paderborn University, Paderborn, Germany and Professor of Sports Economics at Schloss Seeburg University, Seekirchen, Austria. He studied sociology, economics and political science at the University of Trier and at Clark University, Worcester, MA. He received both, his Ph.D. and his “Habilitation” in Business Economics at the University of Trier (the former with a dissertation in labour economics and the latter with a comparative study in industrial relations). In the last 25 years, he refused offers from Max Planck Institute for Human Development Berlin, London School of Economics and Political Science, University of Vienna, Zeppelin University Friedrichshafen, and Turkish German University Istanbul. In the meantime, he has published more than 80 papers in refereed journals and is currently working on a book with the tentative title “Conquering the Pitch: Money, Management and Crowd Wisdom in Football”. When younger, he was a mediocre football player and a competitive marathon runner (although somewhat slower today, he continues to be a dedicated athlete).
