

## **Short bio – Paolo Graziano**

*Paolo Graziano* is Professor of Political Science and Public Policy at the *University of Padua* and Research Associate at the *European Social Observatory*, Brussels. He has held visiting positions at a number of universities, including - among others - Cornell University, University of Cambridge, University of Oxford, Sciences Po Paris, University of Melbourne, University of Washington, European University Institute, University of Roskilde, University of Amsterdam, University of California Berkeley. He is co-editor of *Governance* (2018- ) and President of the APSA Conference Group on Italian Politics (CONGRIPS).

He teaches Political Science, Comparative Politics, and Public Policy Analysis. He has published several authored and edited volumes and journal special issues. His most recent authored book in English is *Europeanization and Policy Change. Italy in Comparative Perspective* (Routledge, 2013). He has also co-edited a book on *The EU and the Domestic Politics of Welfare State Reforms: Europa, Europae* (with S. Jacquot and B. Palier, Palgrave, 2011). Currently, he is editing a Special Issue of *West European Politics* with Manuela Caiani (SNS) on “Party Dealignment, Economic Crisis and Varieties of Populism”. His most recent book is “Il consumo critico” (Il Mulino, 2016), co-authored with Francesca Forno, and in October 2018 his new book entitled “Neopopulismi” will be published by Il Mulino.
