This research project investigates the role of exhibitions as spaces intrinsic to the public sphere—sites of aesthetic experimentation and narrative construction. It explores how the exhibition has functioned as a dynamic stage for the development of experimental proposals that have left a lasting impact on cultural production. Within this framework, exhibition design emerges as a critical component, complementing curatorial content and illuminating historical episodes that merit renewed attention. The study thus aims to examine the cultural and design foundations of exhibition spatiality, with particular emphasis on moments when the act of exhibiting transcends its function as a vehicle for display and becomes an autonomous form of artistic practice.

The PhD dissertation was part of the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Innovative Training Network EU Horizon 2020 project "TACK / Communities of Tacit Knowledge: Architecture and its Ways of Knowing," coordinated by ETH Zurich. The initiative involved ten European universities (among which: ETH Zurich, TU Delft, the KTH School of Architecture, the Oslo School of Architecture and Design, and the Bartlett School of Architecture), three leading architectural institutions (the Architekturzentrum Wien, the Nieuwe Instituut, and the Flanders Architecture Institute), and nine distinguished architecture design offices offering the opportunity for a series of secondments with the partners of the network.

Titled *Attitudes Beyond Style: Investigating the 21st Century Post-Exuberance Architecture across Biennials/Triennials and Everyday Practice*, examined the changing practice of architecture and its actors over the past decade, focusing on how the values, discourse, and production consider a complex system of elements that often transcend disciplinary boundaries. In other words, it investigated the "codes," or rather the specific characters, informing a renovated way of practicing architecture that emerged more clearly in Europe in the aftermath of the 2008 financial crisis. In order to do so, the investigation started from what is made explicit in encounters such as exhibitions, which have been used as fundamental lenses to reconstruct a recent history not yet historicised. A history of exhibitions: of what they are made of, who makes them, and how their use and conception has changed over time. Part I therefore set out to systematize a whole series of evidences (topics covered, language used, actors involved, etc.) that explicitly demonstrated a change in the way architecture is conceived and practiced. However, while the exhibitions served as a starting point for the reconstruction of a recent historical framework, thus providing evidence to support research hypotheses; Part II aimed to unravel the more implicit features pertinent to such a renewed way of practicing, or the more hidden aspects rooted in the design process at the basis of any expression. Environments of Resistance for Social Individuals investigated how today the boundaries between public and private vanish until they conflagrate. While 'home' is becoming more and more a place for work and an instrument of subsistence, 'domesticity' invades every field of human activity, with shops that are camouflaged as lounges, offices as game rooms, and restaurants as kitchens. The 'sharing economy' has converted intimacy into an economic asset, forcing large strata of society, if indeed fortunate enough to own a house, to cede a portion of it and taking refuge in the little space left. As a reaction and antidote to this, *Environments of Resistance for Social Individuals* sought an alternative, resulting in a collection of authentic private spaces designed with the sole purpose of accommodating the idiosyncrasies of their occupants.

Statement of interest

Exhibitions have always consistently been at the core of my interests and work, serving as the foundation of my professional and academic career across multiple roles: as a designer, employing them as an instrument to explore new display strategies, aiming not only to shape their content but also to integrate them as a key element of the project; as a curator, conceiving the set-up as an outcome of the simultaneous development of the physical form and the content of the exhibition, in an attempt to overcome the dichotomy between exhibition designer and curator; finally, as a researcher, developing a personal—yet historically rooted—method to analyze exhibitions as a lens to disentangle contemporary design and artistic practices. I, in fact, belong to a generation that has made the exhibition a vehicle to explore the present and an instrument to define a design agenda.

I firmly believe in the potential of exhibitions, particularly in their ability to express values and intentions with a freedom that built architecture often cannot achieve, due to the constraints represented by budget, norms and regulation. Their flexibility and "speed" allow them to tackle urgent and timely issues, materializing in ever-evolving forms that align with the spirit of the times. In this way, exhibitions serve as litmus tests, reflecting not only a broad disciplinary scope but also a wider cultural, social, political, and economic context.

Another distinctive aspect of exhibitions, which I find rich with potential for an academic investigation, is their positioning across architectural design and narrative techniques. The concept of exhibition that I advocate for extends beyond the mere display, creating a dynamic interplay between content, container, and participants, ultimately defining new exhibition formats. In other words, an exhibition that explores innovative balances between the physicality of the installation and the potential of its narrative. This is a subject that I have been working on as a designer for over ten years—both through collaborations with architecture firms and institutions, as well as with Fosbury Architecture,—and that I have been studying academically for the last four years, with a particular focus on a recent historical period (2000-2020) and a specific type of exhibition (biennials and triennial).

The opportunity of this research assignment therefore represents a unique chance to continue investigating in this field and to make use of what I have acquired in terms of content, methodology and connections. At the same time, I am eager to apply the skills I have

developed while integrating them with the new perspectives that might be offered by the research network and by the Free University of Bozen. I believe this experience will not only foster personal growth but also enable the pursuit of meaningful and innovative outcomes in a field that I consider fundamental to contemporary architecture, design, and artistic practice.

In conclusion, as I am particularly fond of the importance of cross-pollination between disciplines, I believe that my background as an architect could be a useful tool in developing this research project in an institution dedicated to design and art, ultimately unfolding future trajectories for research and practice.
